Candidates should complete and email the nomination form by this deadline to info@norwoodforum.org. Please note (as set out in the proposed new Constitution (para.6d) to be voted on at the AGM on 6 September 2025): "Any individual being proposed for election or serving as a member of the Forum committee must comply with the Constitution and policies of the Forum. In respect of the Conflict of Interest Policy, the individual must consider and declare on the nomination form any actual, potential, or perceived conflicts of interest. The Committee reserves the right to request further information from nominees regarding their application to serve on the Committee, including information regarding association with Norwood, previous experience or expertise that may be relevant, and possible conflicts of interest. Nominees agree to make available relevant information for consideration by the Committee Leadership Group."

Norwood Forum AGM will be held as part of the 2025 Annual Community Review on Saturday 6 September 2025, 2pm-4.30pm at The Old Library, 14-16 Knights Hill, West Norwood, London SE27 0HY. New Committee Members will serve from the first committee meeting following this meeting, at which meeting the new Officers will be elected.

If any nominations are rejected, the Chair will advise the prospective Committee Member accordingly.
