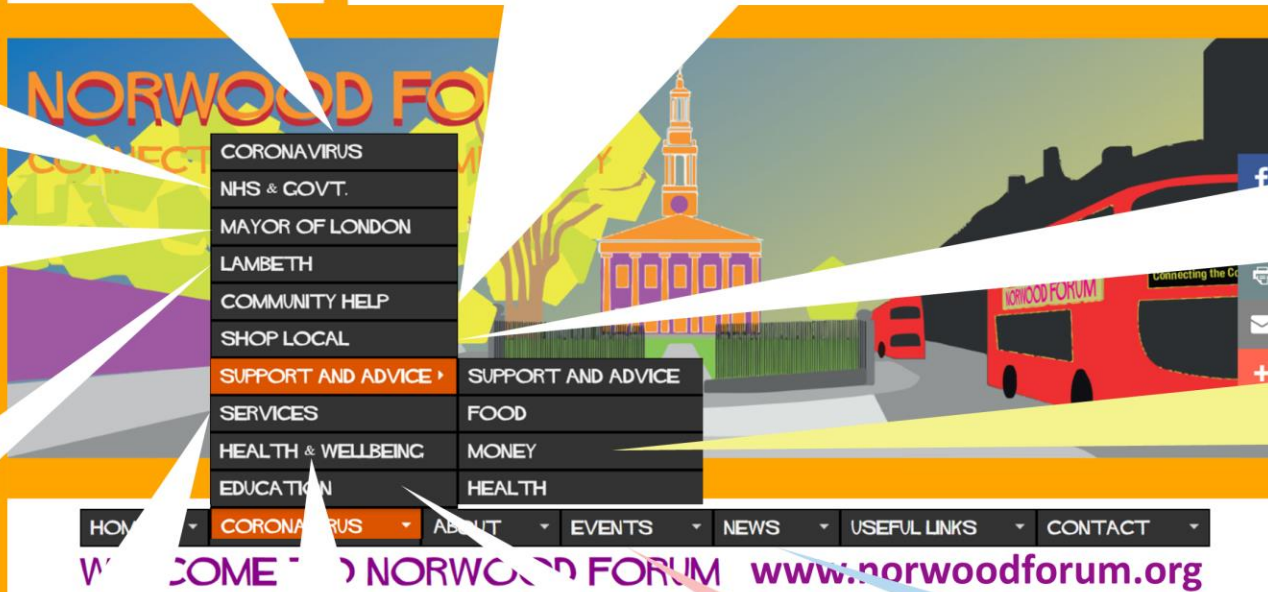

A major focus of our “**Connecting the Community**” initiative is our **Community Safety Partnership** with the main objective of introducing and supporting activities which cross social, cultural and organisational boundaries, including those planned by the Police, NHS and Council.

There were three physical meetings before Lockdown 1 and two via Zoom since, plus extensive connectivity through attendance at other meetings. Each led to practical co-operation between players who had not previously met, as well as agreement to support programmes already being planned by others.

Most notably:

Rathbone Society and Salvation Army - collaborating to support young people in the Tulse Hill area

Lambeth Council and London Grid for Learning - access to their online safety materials

Station 2 Station BID and Lambeth Made team - discussing co-operation, including plans for a consortium of Lambeth BIDs to organise local recruitment and training.

Recipe for West Norwood Bean Chilli, feel free to adapt

1 red pepper de-seeded/chopped	1 teaspoon sea salt	Mix: pepper, onion, mushrooms, spices, salt, oil
1 red onion chopped	1 tablespoon olive oil	and roast uncovered in a deep pan for 25
250g chestnut mushrooms, chopped	1 can cannellini beans	minutes at 200c / 180c (fan) / gas mark 6.
2 teaspoons ground coriander	1 can black beans	Drain and rinse the beans and add along with the
2 teaspoons ground cumin	1 can kidney beans	tomatoes and stock to the pan and stir.
1 teaspoon chilli flakes	2 cans chopped tomatoes	Leave uncovered and cook for 35 minutes.
1 teaspoon smoked paprika	200ml vegetable stock	Serve with rice/salsa/avocado/cheese/tortillas

2 med potatoes, peeled and chunked	1 400g can chickpeas	1 large onion chopped fine dice	2 tsp sunflower or other oil	2 tsp heaped minced garlic	1 tsp heaped minced ginger	1 tsp green chillies (optional)	1 cinnamon stick (optional)	5 cloves (optional)	1 400g tin tomatoes
1 tsp turmeric powder	2 tsp ground coriander	2 tsp ground cumin	3 tsp garam masala	1 tsp chilli powder (to taste)	2 tsp salt (to taste)				
In large saucepan put oil, cloves, cinnamon	Simmer on low for 2-3 mins	Add onions, cook 5-10 mins until slightly browned	Add garlic, ginger, fresh chilli, cook for 2-3 mins	Add spices. If they stick add splash of water	Stir in salt and let mixture infuse for 1 min	Add tomatoes and cook for 5 mins with lid on	Stir once or twice - add water if getting too dry	Add in potatoes and chickpeas, simmer 45mins	Stir in coriander 5 mins before end
