






#COP26Nbrwood

Whilst international level ambitions were discussed at OOP26 in Glasgow (Sunday, 31 Oct 2021– Friday, 12 Nov 2021), in West Norwood with our own #COP26Norwood on Saturday 6 November 2021, we examined at micro-local level the realistic and practical differences we could make as individuals that wouldn't – quite literally – cost the earth.

We produced a report that outlined the Actions that were agreed during the meeting and these will be reviewed at the beginning of #COP27Norwood which will be on Sunday 13 November at The Portico, to coincide with COP27 in Egypt



The Environment



Through our 15min Neighbourhood project we seek to promote what is available within 15mins walk or cycle ride. Station to Station BID is a valuable partner in this and especially collaborates in our guided food walks exploring the lesser known businesses close to home. We are also promoting the Peddle Me cycle influencer scheme.

#ScrapTheYard community campaign has developed new friendships and connections for everyone involved. We have all learnt new skills – and a heightened appreciation of our diverse neighbourhood – how vulnerable it can be – and how strong we can be as a community when we come together.






























Community Safety Partnership

Over the past year the main focus of the **Community Safety Partnership** has been to help publicise the patient and community engagement events of the two local primary care networks, (supported by Lambeth Wellbeing) and the funding available from the council and others for activities to address social isolation among vulnerable adults and restart the youth engagement and education activities which came to a halt during lockdown.

More recently we have begun the process of publicising and supporting joining up, the consultation activities of the various parts of the NHS, Council and emergency services, beginning with the consultations on the Lambeth Safety Strategy and the London Fire Brigade strategic plan. A consultation on Pharmacy needs across Lambeth has just begin.

We are also seeking to identify support for the youth engagement plans being made for this summer with the addition of streams on mobile phone security and on-line safety and security, organised with the help of Champions4Change, the London Chapter of ISC2 and London Digisafe. Over the year ahead we hope to work with the new Cyber Resilience Centre for London to pilot the first Community Cybersafety Partnership.



We celebrate and promote our local, green spaces and the events and activities that happen in them, including:

West Norwood Cemetery, which holds a Green Flag Award. A Green Flag is visible evidence to the general public that a park or other open space boasts the highest possible environmental standards, is welcoming, safe and well-maintained, and has excellent facilities for the visitor or regular user alike. We collaborate regularly with Friends of West Norwood Cemetery to promote their activities.



We frequently work with Lambeth Parks and commission free guided walks of our lesser known green spaces such as Peabody Hll.

15min Neighbourhood, Wellbeing Welks, Wild Norwood Festival – are examples of our promotion of an active lifestyle.


